Since the release of his 2004 critically acclaimed CD *When I Fall In Love*, Chris Botti—renowned trumpeter and former IU student of the great jazz instructors David Baker and Bill Adam—has become the largest-selling American instrumental artist. His latest Grammy-winning release, *Impressions*, has firmly established Botti as a clear voice in the American music scene—innovating and elevating contemporary music.
